

CHAPTER 6

LAST ADAM

The exploration of human reconciliation detailed in the previous chapter brings us to a place of profound hope and clarity in this chapter. When unrighteousness entered the human experience, it created a massive debt that no regular, marred human being could pay.

This brings us to the core thesis of the current chapter: The Creator lovingly provided the ultimate Kinsman-Redeemer through His Incarnate Word, who flawlessly governed His human flesh with His reasoning mind to achieve perfect likeness and pay the debt of physical death in full.

Since the first human chose non-truth and introduced the consequence of death, humanity required a Last Adam who could flawlessly execute the intended design of the human structure. Yahweh's eternal Word entered the terrestrial realm and assumed human flesh to fulfill this design. By perfectly subjecting His human mind to eternal truth, He entirely avoided the mental inversion that plagues humanity, thereby securing total redemption.

Phase 1: Contextual Foundation

To fully comprehend the magnificent achievement of the Last Adam, we must first understand the catastrophic legal and biological problems inherited from the first Adam.

When the first human, Adam, made the mental decision to place his faith in non-truth, his functional likeness became extremely marred by sin. As a direct consequence of this unrighteousness, physical death entered the terrestrial realm. This consequence of physical death was a profound act of mercy—a delayed judgment by the Creator.

By removing fallen humanity from access to the “Tree of Life,” the Creator ensured that human beings would not live forever in a permanently fractured and unrighteous state of existence. However, this merciful boundary also meant that every human born afterward would inherit the heavy debt of death.

Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned (Rom. 5:12).

Because every human mind eventually stumbles and yields to the powerful instincts of the physical body, no human possesses the unmarred functional likeness required to pay this massive debt.

The Legal Dilemma and the Curse of Jeconiah

Humanity requires a redeemer to repay this debt. However, biblical law required that a redeemer be a literal blood relative, and prophetic scripture required that the ultimate King sit upon the royal throne of David. This has created a severe historical and legal blockade.

Around 3164 AM (597 BCE), the Creator placed a definitive, unbreakable curse on a wicked king of Judah named

Jeconiah (also known as Coniah or Jehoiachin). Because of his extreme rebellion, the Creator declared through the prophet Jeremiah that no biological descendant of Jeconiah would ever prosper or sit upon the royal throne of David.

Thus says the LORD: “Write this man down as childless, a man who shall not succeed in his days, for none of his offspring shall succeed in sitting on the throne of David and ruling again in Judah” (Jer. 22:30).

This curse creates an impossible historical dilemma. The promised Messiah had to be a legal heir to the throne of David to be the King, but the royal lineage passed directly through Jeconiah. If the Messiah was a biological descendant of Jeconiah, He would have been permanently disqualified from the throne by the curse. However, if He were not from the line of David, He could not be the prophesied King.

The Creator provided a flawless, mathematically perfect solution through the virgin birth of the Incarnate Word. The scriptures provide two distinct genealogies to prove the legitimacy of this legal masterpiece.

The genealogy in the Gospel of Luke (chapter 3) traces the biological lineage of Mary. Mary’s lineage traced back to King David through a different son, Nathan, completely bypassing the cursed bloodline of Solomon and Jeconiah. The genealogy in the Gospel of Matthew (chapter 1) traces Joseph’s legal royal lineage, which passes through Jeconiah.

By being conceived by the Holy Spirit in the womb of Mary, the Incarnate Word, name Jesus bypassed the biological seed of Joseph, completely avoiding the curse of Jeconiah. At

the exact same time, because Joseph acted as the legal earthly father (via legal adoption), the Incarnate Word, Jesus inherited the absolute legal right to the throne of David. This miraculous entry into the terrestrial realm allowed the eternal Word to become human flesh, arriving with a perfectly unmarred structural image and unmarred functional likeness while legally holding the title of King.

The Earthly Maturation of the Incarnate Word

As the Last Adam, Jesus did not float above the human experience. He experienced the same physical growth, mental maturation, and biological needs as any other human being.

And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man (Luke 2:52).

He possessed a real physical body that experienced severe hunger, intense exhaustion, and a profound ingrained instinct to survive. Yet, throughout His entire life, He constantly utilized His reasoning to choose eternal truth over temporal instincts. The scriptures provide powerful historical narratives that explicitly illustrate the perfect governance of the mind over the flesh.

Narrative 1: Temptation in the Wilderness

The first major historical proof of the Last Adam's perfect mental governance occurred in 3786 AM (26 CE), immediately after His baptism. Jesus was led by the Spirit into the harsh, unforgiving Judean wilderness for forty days and

forty nights. During this prolonged period, He engaged in a total fast.

From a purely biological perspective, a human body deprived of food for 40 days begins to systematically shut down. The physical flesh screams for nourishment, and the deepest and most powerful survival instincts of the human vessel demand immediate satisfaction. At the exact moment of His greatest physical weakness, the adversary approaches Him with a direct challenge to His physical instincts:

And the tempter came and said to him, “If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread” (Matt. 4:3).

This was not merely a test of divine power but also a profound test of mental governance. The temptation urged Jesus to use His authority to immediately satisfy the screaming demands of His physical body, bypassing the Father’s eternal plan. It was the exact same temptation that the first Adam faced in a beautiful garden—to elevate the desires of the flesh above the Creator’s instructions.

However, the Last Adam did not allow His reasoning to abdicate its throne. Despite the intense biological pain of starvation, Jesus gathered information, evaluated the temporal non-truth of the enemy, and firmly placed his confidence in eternal truth. He responded:

But he answered, “It is written, ‘Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God’” (Matt. 4:4).

Jesus successfully subdued the survival instincts of His human flesh by relying entirely upon the written Word. He proved that the intended design of humanity, where the reasoning mind flawlessly rules the physical container, is entirely possible in the earthly realm.

Narrative 2: Exhaustion at the Well of Sychar

The second personal historical example occurred shortly after Jesus traveled through Samaria. The Gospel of John records that Jesus arrived at Jacob's well near the town of Sychar exactly at the sixth hour, which corresponds to the intense heat of high noon. The text explicitly notes that Jesus was "wearied as he was from his journey" (John 4:6).

His physical container was thoroughly exhausted from walking long distances over rugged terrain under the intense sun of the Middle East. He was dehydrated, fatigued, and in desperate need of rest and water. While his disciples went into the city to buy food, a Samaritan woman approached him at the well.

In that ancient culture, Jewish men did not speak to Samaritan women because of historical and social hostility toward them. Furthermore, Jesus' physical body actively demands hydration and sleep. Yet, Jesus deliberately subordinated His own intense physical discomfort and the cultural norms of the day to fulfill a higher spiritual purpose. He engaged the woman in a profound, life-changing conversation about "living water" (John 4:10).

When His disciples finally returned with food and urged Him to eat, His response flawlessly illustrated His internal hierarchy of governance.

But he said to them, “I have food to eat that you do not know about”... Jesus said to them, “My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work” (John 4:32, 34).

Even when His flesh was completely depleted, His reasoning mind found absolute sustenance and satisfaction in executing eternal truth. The physical needs of the vessel are perfectly governed by the spiritual priorities of the mind.

Narrative 3: Agony of Gethsemane

The ultimate and most extreme historical proof of mind-over-flesh governance occurred on the night of Nisan 14, 3790 AM (April 3, 30 CE) in a quiet olive grove called Gethsemane. Jesus knew with absolute certainty that in a matter of hours, He would face horrific physical torture, the tearing of His flesh, and an agonizing death by crucifixion. Even more terrifying, He knew that He was about to take upon Himself the crushing weight of human unrighteousness and experience total spiritual separation from the Father.

The terror of this impending reality overwhelms his physical body. The biological instinct to flee from pain and preserve life is the strongest force in humans. The Gospel of Luke records that Jesus was in such intense “agony” that His sweat became “like great drops of blood falling down to the ground” (Luke 22:44).

This rare medical phenomenon, known as hematomidrosis, occurs only under the most extreme and severe psychological and emotional stress, causing capillaries to burst and blood to mix with sweat. His flesh was entirely engulfed by

the biological dread.

In this moment of supreme physical and emotional crisis, Jesus falls to the ground and prays. His flesh cried out for escape.

Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me
(Luke 22:42).

This was the genuine, unvarnished voice of human survival instinct. Yet, in the very same breath, the reasoning mind of the Last Adam exerts absolute and unbroken control over the panicked flesh. He immediately followed his plea with a definitive statement of perfect likeness:

Nevertheless, not my will, but yours, be done
(Luke 22:42).

Jesus did not rely on mystical energy to overcome this moment. He used His reasoning mind to consciously and deliberately submit His screaming physical instincts to the eternal truth of the Father's plan. This singular mental decision in the garden secured the victory of the cross before the first nail was driven into Jesus' body. This definitively proves that the Incarnate Word perfectly unified the structural image with the functional likeness, becoming the spotless Lamb qualified to pay humanity's debt.

Phase 2: Lexical & Syntactic Analysis

To fully grasp how the Last Adam achieved perfect obedience and secured human redemption, we must unpack

the mechanical gears of the original Hebrew and Koine Greek. The precise definitions of these biblical words reveal a flawless, highly structured blueprint of the Incarnation and the Kinsman-Redeemer's plan.

The Word and The Flesh

The foundation of the Last Adam's identity begins with his origin. The Hebrew and Greek words for 'Word' are *Dabar* and *Logos*. In the original Greek syntax, *Logos* does not merely mean a spoken syllable or a written sentence. It represents divine expression, ultimate reasoning, the mental faculty, and the Creator's absolute motive. It is an eternal, unchangeable standard for all reality.

Yahweh's eternal Word deliberately enters the physical realm. The Hebrew and Greek words for 'Flesh' are *Basar* and *Sarx*. In biblical anthropology, *Basar* and *Sarx* refer strictly to the soft substance of the living body, the physical container made of muscles, blood, and bones. Importantly, the physical flesh was not inherently evil or wicked in its original design. However, it possesses powerful, natural, sensuous cravings and animalistic instincts required for biological survival, such as hunger, thirst, and self-preservation.

When the scriptures declare that the Word became flesh, it means that Yahweh's ultimate Dynamic Expression—the eternal, flawless *Logos*—took up residence inside a literal, biological *Sarx*. The Word, named Jesus, inhabited the same physical container as every other human, complete with all its natural frailties, exhaustion, and survival instincts. As the Last Adam, He perfectly bridged the gap, proving that the human mind can successfully govern the flesh to continuously mirror

the Creator's Dynamic Expression of righteousness in the physical world. By operating within this physical boundary, he proved that the mind could successfully govern the flesh.

Image and Likeness

To understand how Jesus fulfilled the original design of humanity, the creation blueprint must be clearly defined. As established in earlier chapters, the image, *Tselem*, represents the permanent structural hardware, whereas the likeness, *Demuth*, refers to functional behavioral resemblance.

Jesus, as the Last Adam, was born with the perfectly unmarred *Tselem*, and through constant, daily mental obedience, He actively maintained a flawless, perfect *Demuth*. He perfectly mirrored the Creator's character and actions in the terrestrial realm.

Righteousness

The result of this perfect unity between image and likeness is the realization of absolute righteousness. The Hebrew and Greek words for 'Righteousness' are *Tsedeq* and *Dikaiosyne*. In the original Greek, *Dikaiosyne* is defined as the state of being who one ought to be. It is a condition of total integrity, virtue, and correctness in thinking, feeling, and acting.

Dikaiosyne is not a passive title but rather a highly active moral reality. This means that the reasoning mind correctly gathers information, accurately evaluates it against eternal truth, and executes proper and flawless physical action. Jesus Christ was the only human to ever continuously,

unbreakably sustain *Dikaiosyne* throughout His entire physical life, making Him uniquely qualified for the role of a savior.

The Kinsman-Redeemer

Because Jesus achieved perfect righteousness, he was legally qualified to save fallen humanity. The mechanical gears of this rescue are found in ancient biblical law.

The Hebrew word for ‘Kinsman Redeemer’ is *Go’el*. In the highly structured legal system of ancient Israel, the *Go’el* was a specific family member who had the legal right and responsibility to buy back a relative who had fallen into extreme poverty and sold themselves into slavery or to buy back family property that had been lost to a debt (Lev. 25:25, 47-49).

Three absolute structural requirements must be met for an individual to act as a *Go’el*.

1. **Blood Relation:** The redeemer had to be a literal, physical blood relative (kinsman) of the debtor.

2. **Capacity to Pay:** The redeemer must possess the total necessary wealth or perfection to pay the debt in full.

3. **Willingness:** The redeemer must willingly choose to step forward and pay the ransom.

The original language makes this undeniably clear: a redeemer cannot be a distant, unrelated entity or purely a mystical spirit. The *Go’el* requires actual human blood. This lexical reality forms the absolute foundation for the mathematical and legal necessity of the Incarnation of the Word to save humanity.

Phase 3: Theological Coherence Alignment

The meticulous integration of these profound historical narratives and precise lexical definitions forms a flawless and mathematically coherent blueprint for the Last Adam. This blueprint demonstrates how the Creator, via the Incarnation, fulfilled the intended design of humanity and legally secured its redemption.

As established, the first Adam made a catastrophic mental decision to place his faith in non-truth, resulting in a marred, unrighteous likeness and the introduction of physical death. Because the structural image, *Tselem*, of humanity remained unmarred, the vessel was still capable of functioning, but it was hopelessly enslaved to the debt of death and the unrighteous instincts of the flesh, *Basar*. Humans were completely incapable of paying their own debts because every human possessed a heavily marred functional likeness, *Demuth*.

To solve this impossible legal and biological problem, Yahweh initiated a magnificent provision for atonement. The eternal Word, *Logos* steps out of eternity and is conceived by the Holy Spirit. By bypassing the biological line of Joseph and coming through the uncursed lineage of Mary, the Incarnate Word avoided the generational curse of Jeconiah while securing the legal right to the royal throne.

Because the legal role of the Kinsman-Redeemer, *Go'el* absolutely requires the redeemer to be a literal blood relative, the eternal Word had to become human flesh, *Sarx*. Jesus Christ entered the terrestrial realm wearing the exact same physical container as every other human, complete with the biological drives for food, water, rest, and survival.

However, unlike the first Adam, Jesus governs these temporal instincts perfectly and continuously. Throughout His physical growth and mental maturation, He constantly utilized His reasoning mind, *Nous* to evaluate physical desires against the eternal truth of Yahweh the Father.

In the starvation of the wilderness, the exhaustion at the well of Sychar, and the absolute terror of Gethsemane, Jesus never allowed the flesh to overrule his mind. By flawlessly subduing the survival instincts of his human container via the Word of Yahweh, He successfully maintained a perfect, unbroken functional likeness, *Homoioima*. He achieved absolute and continuous righteousness, *Dikaiosyne*.

This perfect obedience qualifies Him as the ultimate Kinsman-Redeemer. Jesus Christ never needed reconciliation, because He never changed His mind away from the truth. He never needed redemption because He had no inherited debt of sin and perfectly kept the law of God. Therefore, He possesses the absolute capacity to pay the debt of others.

Payment for human unrighteousness requires the shedding of blood by a completely righteous individual with an unmarred image and perfect likeness. On the cross, Jesus willingly offered His perfect physical life to pay the debt of death inherited from the first Adam. As Apostle Paul mathematically connects it:

For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive” (1 Cor. 15:21-22).

Because He conquered the flesh and defeated the consequence of death through His resurrection, the scriptures officially title

Him the “last Adam.”

Thus, it is written, “The first man Adam became a living being;” the last Adam became a life-giving spirit (1 Cor. 15:45).

The first Adam was given life but lost his functional likeness, bringing death to his descendants. The Last Adam perfectly maintained His likeness, paid the debt, and now possesses the authority to grant vigorous and eternal spiritual life to any unrighteous human who changes his mind and trusts in His payment.

Through this singular, flawless act, the Incarnate Word, Jesus Christ, permanently operates as both the ultimate King of the lineage of David and the merciful High Priest who atones for the people (Heb. 2:17). The coherence of this exact truth is flawless.

Who: The singular, indivisible Creator manifesting as the Incarnate Word, *Logos*, named Jesus Christ, operating as the “last Adam” (Heb. 2:14).

What: The perfect, continuous realization of spiritual righteousness, *Dikaiosyne*. By flawlessly and continuously subjecting the human mind to His own eternal truth, He perfectly unifies the structural image, *Tselem* with the functional likeness, *Demuth*.

When: Historically, during His entire earthly manifestation, culminating in the cross on Nisan 14, 3790 AM (April 3, 30 CE).

Where: Stationed squarely in the terrestrial realm, wearing the exact same physical container, *Basar* as humanity.

Why: To perfectly fulfill the divine will (Heb. 10:7),

pay the unpayable debt of death as the ultimate Kinsman-Redeemer, *Go'el*, and secure total reconciliation for humanity.

CONCLUSION

This exhaustive evaluation of historical narratives, lexical definitions, and scriptural coherence conclusively defines the magnificent identity and work of the Last Adam. The findings explicitly prove that the Incarnation was not a symbolic gesture but an absolute legal and biological necessity to save humanity.

Because the first Adam abdicated the throne of his reasoning mind, a debt of physical death was placed upon the human structure, and the functional likeness of humanity was severely marred. Furthermore, when you occasionally stumble, you do not need to carry the heavy weight of guilt that comes with it. You cannot pay your own debt, and you do not have to do so.

Your Kinsman Redeemer has already paid it in full. You are securely held by the Last Adam, the life-giving Spirit who has restored your capacity to walk in His likeness with peace, joy, and unbreakable grace.

He knows exactly how heavy your physical container is. Because He wore the same flesh.
